INSTRUCTIONS FOR HANGING YOUR QUILT OR RUG IN YOUR NEW "CASUAL CLAMP" HANGERS

Note: If you purchased an unfinished hanger and have finished it yourself we recommend that you protect your quilt or rug from your finish. If you have any questions give us a call.

1. Use a slightly damp clean cloth to remove any dust on the hanger.
2. Place your quilt or rug out flat on a table or the floor. Determine where you want the "Casual Clamps" to be and measure the distance between the keyhole slots that are on the backside of your hangers. Mark these distances on your wall. *Note:* For best results, the quilt or rug should be taut between the clamps.
3. You may choose to use drywall anchors if placement does not align with the studs inside your wall. Fasten a screw in your wall at the place you would like the center of each "Casual Clamp" to be. Leave the screw heads slightly out from the wall surface.
4. Take only the back piece of the hanger and try placing it on the screw. The screw may have to be adjusted in or out from the wall surface so that the keyhole slot can engage. The hangers should lay flat on the wall. This allows for easier adjustment later. When the screws are properly aligned take the back pieces down and lay them on a table or the floor with the grooved side facing you. Place your quilt or rug so that the top binding lays in the groove and does not cover the holes for the knobs.
5. Now place the front part of the hanger on top of the quilt or rug. Make sure that the numbers or letters on the inside of the hanger are facing each other, not end for end. Screw in the knobs, tightening until there is enough tension to hold the quilt or rug. Place each assembled hanger over the head of the screw and pull down until it engages in the keyhole slot. Straighten hangers on the wall as necessary.
