


Art In A Pinch

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Instructions For Hanging Your “Original” Art In A Pinch Hanger

Note: If you purchased an unfinished hanger and are finishing it yourself we recommend that you protect your quilt or rug from your finish. If you have any questions give us a call.

1. Use a slightly damp clean cloth to remove any dust on the hanger (inside & out).
2. Measure the distance between the keyhole slots on the back of the hanger and mark this on your wall. The slots are placed in 16” increments to line up with the studs in your wall. You may choose to use drywall anchors if placement does not align with studs. *Note for Special Orders:* The placement may not be in 16” increments.
3. Depending on the size of your hanger, fasten two or three screws in the wall. Leave the screw heads slightly out from the wall surface.
4. Take only the back piece of the hanger and try placing it on the screws. The screws may have to be adjusted in or out from the wall surface so that the keyhole slots can engage. When the screws are properly aligned, take the back piece down and lay it on a table or the floor with the grooved side facing you. Place your quilt or rug so that the top binding lays in the groove and does not cover the holes for the knobs.
5. Now place the front part of the hanger on top of the quilt or rug. Make sure that the numbers or letters on the inside of the hanger are facing each other, not end for end. Screw in the knobs, tightening until there is enough tension to hold the quilt or rug. Place the assembled hanger over the heads of the screws and pull down until it engages in the keyhole slots.

Silk Rug Note: Once in a while silk rugs with fringe have a tendency to want to slip out of hangers because of the slippery fibers. To solve this problem try one or more of the following: 1. Wrap the outside of the rug and fringe with a strip of fabric, making it small enough so it doesn’t show outside of the hanger. 2. Place a strip of fabric or a small 1/8” wooden dowel between the fringe and rug. When placing in the hanger, make sure the thicker area sits in the hanger groove.
